# Morning Call

## Fabric and projects designed by Hoodie's Collection Instructions by Jean Ann Wright

Skill level: Intermediate

### General Instructions and Supplies:

Black and ivory sewing thread

Steam-a-seam 1/4" fusible web for placemats and coasters

Thermal heat reducing batting for coasters, potholder, oven mitt and kettle mat

Timtex interfacing for fabric boxes

Water soluble fabric marking pen

\* Seam allowances for all projects are 1/4" unless otherwise indicated

### Cinderella Apron

| Fabric B 1/2 yard | 5291 CHESTNUT | 5290 TOMATO     |
| Fabric C 1/2 yard | 5287 COCOA    | 5287 TOMATO     |

#### Apron Cutting

- Fabric A** Cut one 20" high x 42" wide skirt piece, fold in half from side to side to make a piece 20" x 21". Position your ruler at the bottom center fold and slant in 3" to the center top to make an angle cutting through both pieces. Position the ruler on the outside edge of the skirt piece cut slant in 6" to make an angle cut. Draw a gentle curve from the center front of the two skirt pieces going up 3" to the outside edge of the two skirt pieces and cut along the curve line.  
Cut one 12" x wof strip, recut into two 12" x 21" pieces for apron bib front and bib facing. Stack the 2 pieces with right sides together and measure up 1" from the bottom. Position your ruler at the 1" mark and slant in 5" from the top corner and cut at an angle on both sides. Draw a gentle curve along the slanted cut from the bottom to the top of the 2 bib pieces and trim this curve on both sides.
- Fabric B** Cut one 6 1/2" x wof strips then recut into four 6 1/2" squares for pockets.  
Cut one 5" x wof strip for apron ruffle.
- Fabric C** Cut two 4" x wof strips for apron waist ties.  
Cut two 2 1/2" x wof strips for apron bib ties.

#### Apron Sewing

1. Fold the fabric C apron ties in half lengthwise and press the fold line. Sew along one short end and the raw edge of the long side. Turn right sides out and press. Make 4 ties. Set aside.
2. Place two fabric G pocket pieces with right sides together. Sew up one side, across the top and down the opposite side. Turn right sides out. Turn the raw edges at the bottom of the apron pocket 1/4" in towards the center of pocket and press the fold lines. Position one pocket on each of the two apron skirt pieces and stitch in place.
3. Sew the 2 fabric A apron skirt pieces together along the center seam line. Press both seam allowances to one side.
4. Hem the bottom of the fabric B apron ruffle. Slightly gather the top of the apron ruffle, then sew it to the bottom of the apron skirt with right sides together. Fold the ruffle down with the gathered seam facing up and top stitch in place at the bottom of the apron skirt.
5. Pin the apron waist ties in place 1/2" down from the top of the apron skirt. Fold the raw edge on each side of the apron skirt in 1/4" and press fold line. Fold in again about 3/8" and pin and press in place to hem the sides of the apron. Stitch the ties in place as you sew the hems.
6. Pin the apron bib ties to the top of the right side of the bib front. Position the bib facing on top of the bib front with right sides together. Sew up one side, across the top and down the opposite side of the bib leaving the bottom of the bib open. Turn right sides out and press the seam lines.
7. Pin the front of the apron skirt to the front of the bib easing in excess fabric on skirt if necessary. Sew the skirt and bib together. Fold the bib front up and press the seam line. Turn the bottom raw edge of the bib facing up 1/4" and press the fold line. Pin in place to slightly cover the stitching line where the bib front and the skirt are sewn together. Top stitch the bib facing in place from the front of the apron bib.

### Kettle Mats

Size: 10" x 10"

| Fabric requirements | Kettle Mat One | Kettle Mat Two |
|---------------------|----------------|----------------|
| Fabric A 1/3 yard   | 5288 POWDER    | 5288 AQUA      |
| Fabric B 1/3 yard   | 5291 CHESTNUT  | 5291 CARROT    |
| Fabric C 1/8 yard   | 5296 BLACK     | 5296 BLACK     |

#### Cutting directions for Kettle Mats

Fabric A One 10 x 10 square.

Fabric B One 10 x 10 square.

Fabric C One 2" x width of fabric strip.

Thermal heat reducing batting – cut one 10" square.

#### Sewing Kettle Mats

1. Layer Fabric A and Fabric B squares with batting in the middle. Quilt in diagonal lines to make a crosshatch pattern. Space the quilting lines about 1 1/2" apart.
2. Fold the Fabric C strip in half lengthwise with right sides together. Press the fold line. Starting at the top right corner pin the strip all around the outside edges of the kettle mat with raw edges together. Turn folded edge to back and stitch in place to finish.

### Potholders

Size: 6-1/2" x 10"

| Fabric Requirements | Pot Holder One | Pot Holder Two |
|---------------------|----------------|----------------|
| Fabric A 1/3 yard   | 5290 POWDER    | 5290 AQUA      |
| Fabric B 1/3 yard   | 5289 MUSTARD   | 5289 APPLE     |
| Fabric C 1/8 yard   | 5287 BLACK     | 5287 BLACK     |

#### Cutting Pot Holders

Fabric A (1) full oval and (1) partial oval using pattern provided.

Fabric B (1) full oval and (1) partial oval using pattern provided.

Fabric C (2) 2" x width of fabric strips.

Thermal heat reducing batting - (1) full oval and (1) partial oval using pattern provided.

#### Sewing Potholders

1. Layer the Fabric A and Fabric B potholder pieces with thermal batting in between fabrics. Quilt in a crosshatch pattern across the oval and then the partial oval pieces about 1 1/2" apart.
2. Fold the 2 Fabric C pieces in half lengthwise and press the fold line.
3. Cut a piece of Fabric C the same width as the flat top of the quilted partial oval. Line raw edges of Fabric C strip to flat edge of partial oval. Sew in place, then turn folded edge to back and top stitch in place.
4. Cut a 4" piece of the Fabric C binding, turn the raw edges in towards the fold line and top stitch in place for the hanging loop.
5. Pin the partial oval rounded edge even with one end of the full oval. Position the hanging loop at the top end of the potholder. Pin in place. Use the second Fabric C strip to bind the outside edge of the potholder to finish.

## Oven Mitts

Size: 6 1/2" x 14"

### Fabric Requirements

Fabric A 1/2 yard

Fabric B 1/2 yard

### Oven Mitts One

5286 VINTAGE

5287 COCOA

### Oven Mitts Two

5286 AQUA

5287 EGG

### Cutting Oven Mitts

Fabric A Two long mitt piece and two short mitt piece using pattern provided.

Fabric B Two ovals using pattern provided.

One 2 1/4" x width of fabric strip for binding and hanging loop.

Thermal heat reducing batting – cut 1 batting piece from each of the patterns.

### Sewing Oven Mitts

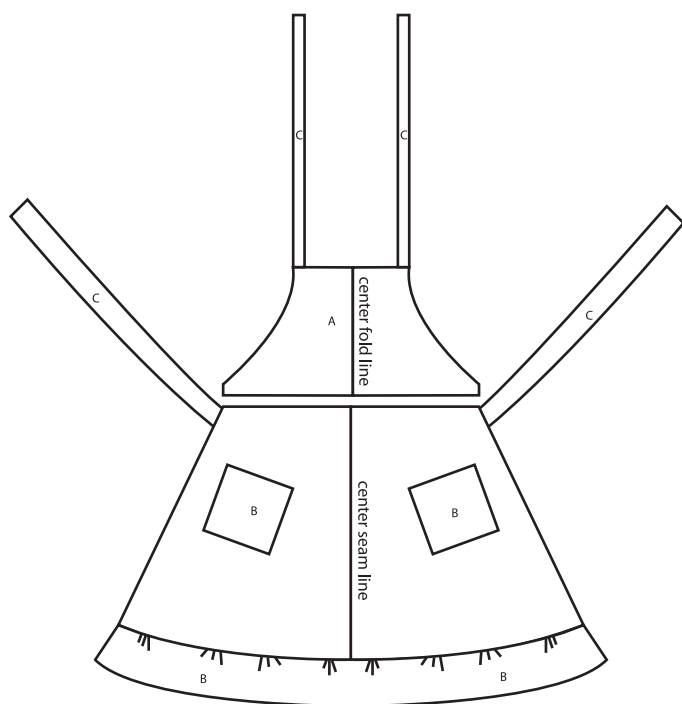
1. Layer all of the matching pieces of Fabric A with the thermal batting and quilt layers together.

2. Layer the Fabric B ovals with thermal batting and quilt the layers together.

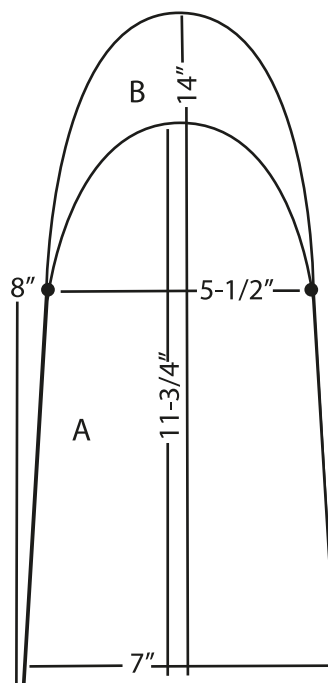
3. Position the two mitt pieces with the flat edges even at the bottom and right sides of the mitt together. Sew from the flat bottom up each side 11 1/2" and fold the rounded edges out.

Position the oval to fit the rounded edges and sew all around the oval. Finish the seams with a zig-zag stitch. Turn right sides out.

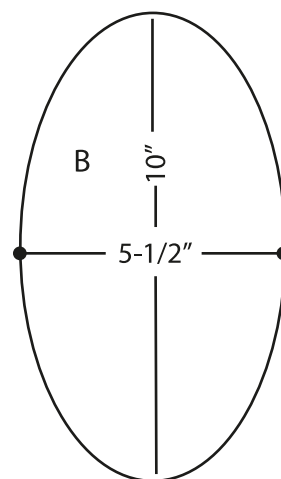
4. Use Fabric B strip to bind the bottom edge of the mitt and make the hanging loop using the same method as for the potholders

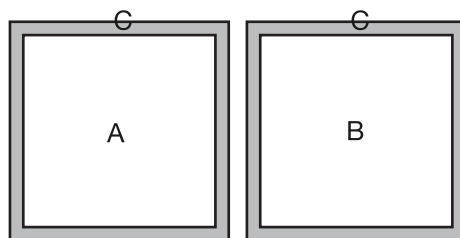


Oven Mitt Pattern

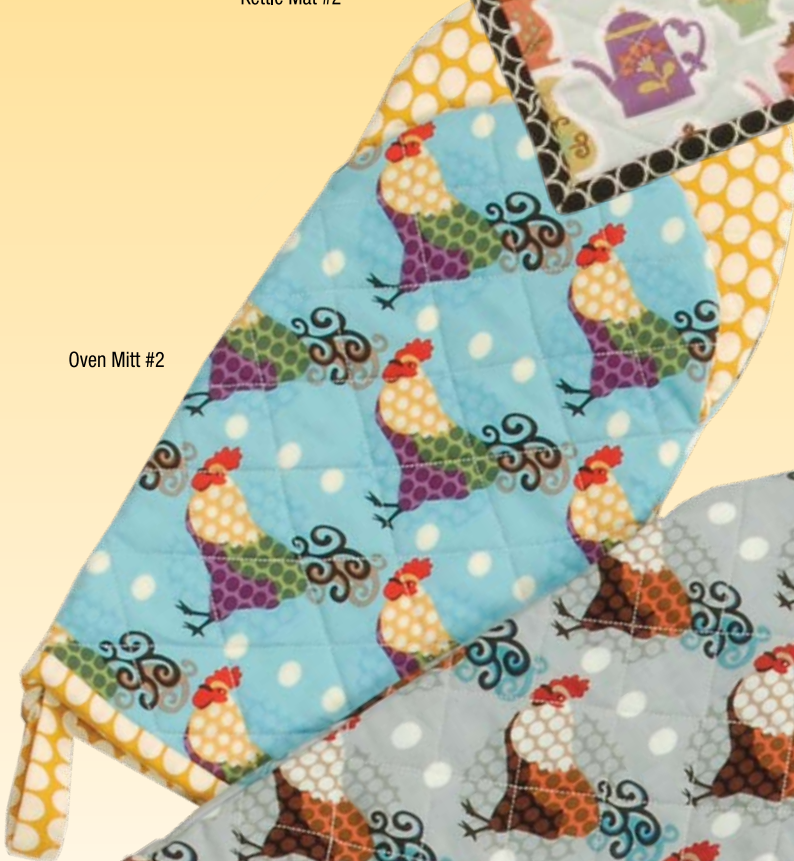

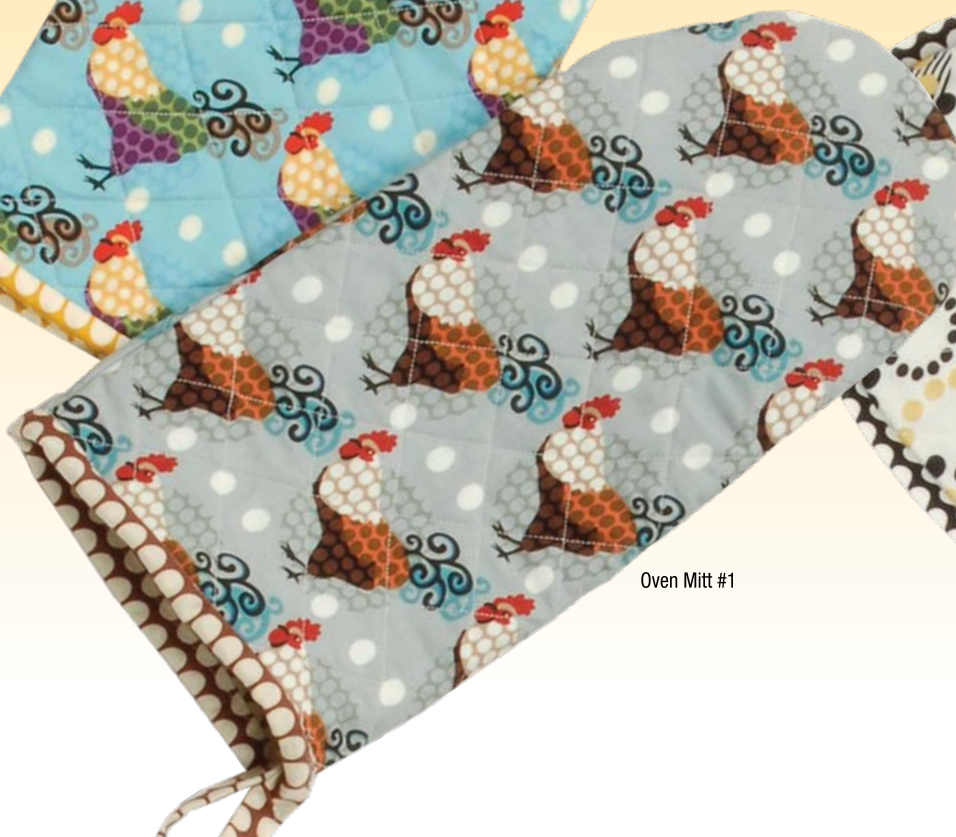


Kettle Mat #2
